

INKLUSI KEY ACHIEVEMENTS JANUARY – JUNE 2023



SOCIO-CULTURAL, ECONOMIC AND POLITICAL BENEFITS

- ▶ **261 community-based groups** formed to deliver services to marginalised people
- ▶ **12,548** instances of marginalised people accessing services (8,942 women, 3,276 men, 330 transgender, 1,121 people with disability)
- ▶ **117 economic groups** formed with membership of 4,022 marginalised people (4,010 women, 12 men, 10 people with disability)
- ▶ **1,962** instances of marginalised people receiving political empowerment capacity-building (1,444 women, 248 men, 0 transgender, 39 people with disability)
- ▶ **1004** instances of marginalised people participating in public decision-making processes (681 women, 322 men, 1 transgender, 105 people with disability)
- ▶ **47,588 participants in Mitra activities** (35,429 women, 12,130 men, 29 transgender, 3,079 people with disability)



SOCIAL NORMS AND PUBLIC DISCOURSE

- ▶ **Incremental changes** in stakeholder **GEDSI awareness and attitudes**
- ▶ National Women's Development Consultation generated significant media coverage:
5,723 social media interactions
44 media articles nationwide



EXPANDING INKLUSI'S PARTNERS

- ▶ **8 Mitra commenced** their multi-year projects
- ▶ Partnership agreements signed with **3 new Mitra** and **8 new research partners**
- ▶ **New partnership** with INFID to provide technical advice and support to government on the establishment of a CSO endowment fund



CSO CAPACITY

- ▶ **INKLUSI Secretariat trained 270 Mitra staff** (194 women, 76 men) in GEDSI, partnerships, grant management, and monitoring and evaluation



PARTNERSHIPS AND COLLECTIVE ACTION

- ▶ In quarter 2, Mitra engaged with **462** stakeholders, **294** of whom were government stakeholders
- ▶ Mitra had first-time interactions with **131 stakeholders**
- ▶ **Mitra collective action** on RPJPN and employment of people with disability



NATIONAL AND SUB-NATIONAL POLICY INFLUENCE

- ▶ Mitra collaborated to convene National Women's Development Consultation, **leading to greater GEDSI focus in draft RPJPN**
- ▶ Migrant CARE **helped influence policy changes to increase access to social security for migrant workers**, including through ASEAN
- ▶ **BaKTI's Sekolah Inklusif pilot launched in Kendari District** to improve access to education for children with disability
