TIWUL CAHAYA: ECONOMIC RESILIENCE FOR FORMER MIGRANT WORKERS IN TANGGULANGIN VILLAGE



A group of former migrant workers known as SERBUMI, which is assisted by INKLUSI Partner Migrant CARE in the village of Tanggulangin, Kebumen, Central Java, has become a beacon of hope for their community with their livelihoods initiative called "Tiwul Cahaya". Since 2016, Migrant CARE has been implementing the DESBUMI program (Village that Cares for Migrant

Workers) in Tanggulangin Village. The SERBUMI groups, composed of mostly return female Indonesian Migrant Workers (PMI) and their families, focuses on organising former PMI to strengthen the group's livelihoods by utlising local resources. Unlock the full story here bit.ly/TiwulCahaya2



The Australia-Indonesia Partnership Towards an Inclusive Society, or INKLUSI, is working to increase the participation of marginalised groups in, and their benefit from, Indonesia's socio-cultural, economic and political development. INKLUSI works with government and civil society partners to advance their work in gender equality, the rights of persons with disabilities and social inclusion. INKLUSI supports the Government of Indonesia's agenda for inclusion, including through national development plans and the Sustainable Development Goals. INKLUSI is an 8-year (2021 - 2029), up to AUD 120 million Australian Government program. It is partnering with 11 Indonesian civil society organisations, 8 research partner institutions and their networks across 32 provinces, 129 districts and 650 villages in Indonesia.
